**ARAMARK PARTNERS WITH NATIONAL PARK SERVICE
TO OFFER NEW KANTISHNA EXPERIENCE BUS TRIP**

*NEW TOUR OFFERS TRAVELERS A JOURNEY TO "THE END OF THE ROAD" WITH INTERPRETIVE
NARRATION*

DENALI NATIONAL PARK, ALASKA (May 30, 2007) – Denali transportation concessioner Doyon/ARAMARK Joint Venture (JV) is partnering with the National Park Service to offer a new Kantishna Experience bus trip for Denali National Park and Preserve’s summer visitors beginning in June. The trip, offered once a day beginning June 8 through Aug. 31, costs \$129.00 plus the park entrance fee.

Kantishna lies within one of the America's most popular tourist destinations, Denali National Park. Also known as "The End of the Road" and "The Heart of Denali National Park," this small town at the end of the 95-mile Denali road is only accessible by bus from the park entrance or by small aircraft to Kantishna Airstrip.

The new Kantishna Experience is a 12-hour journey featuring interpretive narration provided jointly by a driver guide and a JV-sponsored NPS ranger that joins the trip at Wonder Lake. The round trip into the heart of the park also includes lunch and a stop at the historic cabin of Fannie Quigley, an infamous Kantishna resident who settled in the area during its Gold Rush heyday in the early 1900s and remained there until her death in 1944.

Buses will pick up passengers at any of the four ARAMARK-managed lodges, McKinley Chalet Resort, McKinley Village Lodge, Grande Denali Lodge and the Denali Bluffs Hotel, as well as the Wilderness Access Center in the park and the Denali Princess Wilderness Lodge. The buses will be the same style as the Visitor Transportation System (VTS) shuttle buses traveling to Wonder Lake and Kantishna.

“This new offering is the first time that a driver/ranger interpretive team will share in-depth information about the park’s natural and cultural history, including the Kantishna Mining District and its inhabitants,” said Steve Halloran, regional director of sales and marketing for ARAMARK and the Denali Park Resorts. “Participants will be able to partake in a true Alaska experience, learning about people such as miners, market hunters, climbers, and others all coming to seek something different for themselves, and the natural history and wildlife this remote and beautiful area offers.”

Home to North America's tallest mountain, Mt. McKinley, diverse plant life and abundant populations of moose, caribou, Dall sheep, grizzly bears and wolves, Denali National Park and Preserve offers a unique visitor experience due to minimal intrusion from outside traffic. Access to the six-million-acre park is limited to a single road that allows for prime wildlife viewing, and traffic past the 15-mile point is restricted to buses and vehicles with special permits.

Denali Park Resorts is managed by ARAMARK. Doyon/ARAMARK JV is an authorized concessionaire of the National Park Service.
